ANNUAL REPORT 2018/19

Chairman's Report

I am pleased to provide this report for the year 2018/19, having being elected chairman of the Parish Council for the 2018/1 Civic Year at the May Annual Meeting of Stalmine-with-Staynall Parish Council.

Overview

This has been another busy year for the council with a number of initiatives throughout the year.

April saw the completion of the older children's play area, followed by the installation of two new bus shelters in May and June. The council also commemorated 100 years of the RAF by arranging for the cart flower bed to be painted in red white and blue. A new litter bin was also installed on the playing field, which, if the amount of litter that is removed from it is anything to go by, has proved to have been very well received.

The council was sad to report the resignation of its extra lengthsman in July after almost 12 years of service. These guys do a great job and the council has now recruited a part-time plantsman who is already preparing the pots for this year's summer planting.

Also, in July, the council agreed to take part in an initiative by the Garstang and District Heritage Society to commemorate the centenary of the end of WW1 by remembering the fallen of the old Garstang District Rural Council. A poppy plaque was purchased for siting at St. James's church - which already has a Burma Star Association plaque - as part of the poppy trail.

In November the council marked the centenary of the end of the First World War by installing new gates and a commemorative plaque at the Hall Gate Lane entrance to Stalmine wood.

The wood posed significant challenges in November with the exceptionally warm and dry summer having caused some of the crack willows to fail. The planned schedule of maintenance for the wood had to be put on hold, with resources being directed to the pollarding and removal of the trees posing a health and safety risk.

In December the council was pleased to donate the Christmas tree sited at St.James's Church, with many councillors and the clerk taking part in the well-attended tree lighting service.

March saw the resignation of the council's hard-working chairman Debra Forshaw who had been with the council since May 2016. The chairman thanked her for her time as chairman, her service to the parish and the contribution she made to the community.

Planning applications have continued to be prominent, with the team of councillors assessing planning applications logically and within the process lines. During the year the parish council dealt with 41 planning applications, supporting 26 of them, opposing 11 and being unable to decide on four as councillors living on the road were unable to vote on the application.

Rally

The council was pleased to give its support to the successful event staged in March this year by Legend Fires North West, which was enjoyed by many, both within and outside the community. The chairman thanked the organisers for their £500 donation to the council for it to distribute to charities of its choosing.

Budget

The parish council relies on the precept, which is set each January, as its main source of income, as a result of the borough council's decision, once again, not to pass on the local council tax support funding provided by the Government. We do try to supplement the precept by submitting grant applications to national and local funding sources where possible.

Added to reserves for gate - insufficient funds for metal gate but will put up a quality wooden gate with appropriate carving.

Funds for fencing at playground (£1000)

Additional funds for woodland maintenance (£1500) to help us develop and utilise the wood. This is a great asset for the community that will hopefully be used more by residents/schools etc.

He is central to the parish council's Christmas tree switch-on ceremony as he helps to install the tree and lights (something he is willing to continue doing) and has also laid the wreath on behalf of the parish council at the Remembrance Day service.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank Cllr Jenkinson on behalf of the residents of Stalmine-with-Staynall and councillors past and present for his dedication and hard work in serving this community.

The parish precept

The Parish Precept is the amount of money which the Parish Council receives from Wyre Council to pay for the services it provides. This amount is raised by Wyre Council as that part of your Council Tax relating directly to the Parish Council area. In other words, Wyre Council collects this on our behalf. The way we calculate the precept is as follows:

Each year, just before Christmas, the Parish Council produces an estimate of its likely **expenditure** for the forthcoming year (eg staff costs, parish maintenance, community projects). This will also include an amount to cover the costs of any urgent projects that may be required in the area.

We also estimate our likely **income** for the same period (eg VAT refund, bank interest). The difference between these two figures forms the basis of our precept calculation, which we submit to Wyre Council. In 2018/2019 our precept was £25305.
