In 2018/19, £16000 of the payments were the repayment of the loan to the principal authority for the play area costs. The remaining 'other payments' totalled £13455. This gives a true difference of £13455 - £8418 = £5037. This figure is made up of £3594 for a bus shelter; £901 for new gates and fencing to the council's wood; £296 for a litter bin and a delayed bill of £204 for equipment hire to level the ground around the play area. The remaining £42 can be attributed to minor additional expenditure on parish maintenance throughout the year. The reason the 'other payments' figure doesn't tally with the asset register is because the company that fitted the bus shelter put it in the wrong place. They then provided a new bus shelter in the correct place, but didn't charge for it. The council now has two bush shelters worth £3594 each (£7188) whith a cost of £3594 to the council. In addition the old gates valued at £750 were written off (£7188 + £901 + £296 - £750 = £7635 assets with a slight roundings difference)
